January 2021 Lockdown 3.0 FAQs

Who is currently eligible for a place in school?

Children of key workers, vulnerable children and children without access to a Wi-Fi enabled device or a quiet place to work. If you are a keyworker, please only bring your child to school when necessary, children should still study from home whenever possible.

How will lessons be taught during lockdown for children working from home?

The majority of learning during lockdown will be taught through Google Classrooms. Each class teacher has put work onto Google Classrooms and provided home learning packs for each child. The home learning pack contains your child's Google Classroom login details. If you don't have this information, please email the school office admin@lostockhall.cheshire.sch.uk

Some teachers will also be setting work on Purple Mash. Your child's class teacher will let you know if they are using this platform.

A Remote Learning Summary document will be placed on the school's website.

What do I do if my child doesn't have access to a laptop or tablet?

School have a limited number of notebook computers available for children who have no access to Wi-Fi enabled devices and who are choosing to learn remotely. If your child is in need of a device, please contact the school office to see what arrangements can be made admin@lostockhall.cheshire.sch.uk

Please note devices will not be available until 15th January.

Will my child receive feedback from their teacher for work handed in online?

Completed work can be submitted on Google Classrooms for your child's teacher to mark and give their feedback where appropriate.

Will the work being set for remote learning during lockdown be following the National Curriculum?

Children who are learning from home are using the same work packs as those studying in school. The work being set continues to follow the National Curriculum.

Will there be any live lessons with my child's teacher?

Teachers of classes Year 2/3, Year 4/5 and Year 5/6 are providing live lessons for children learning from home. Your child's teacher will let you know about the arrangements for these lessons.

Teachers of classes Rec/Year 1 and Year 1/2 are providing recorded lessons for your children to access via Google Classrooms from home and in addition will have an occasional live Google Meet session.

How many hours of home-schooling a day should my child be doing?

As a guide, children should be aiming for 3 hours of home learning per day as a minimum.

What should I do if I have concerns that my child is falling behind while they are learning remotely?

In the first instance please contact your child's class teacher via Google Classrooms with any concerns that you may have and they will respond.
